Announcement! Donald Hanson has been appointed as the new Vice-Chief Pro-Tempore until the elections in June. This is because our old one has left Scouting.




Meetings are held at the Wells Beach Fire Department and begin at 2:00 P.M. Attendance has been going good, so far. Let's keep it that way.


