# **Race To Scouting**

September 19th and 21st are this year's Race To Scouting registration dates. New youth and adult applications need to be turned in to the appropriate district location on September 21st. District training will be held to help your unit have a successful Race To Scouting Recruitment Night sign-up. Information can and should be sent to your local newspaper, radio station, and television station for promotion of your recruitment night.

This year, the Race To Scouting Honorary Chair will be Bill Ryan, owner of Oxford Plains Speedway. Bill was a natural fit with our theme and he is working on incentives for new boys to register with local packs and troops.

Our Sponsor for this year's event is NAPA Auto Parts.

Look over the Race To Scouting training materials that you will receive at your district training to make sure that you have a great night set up for the parents and the boys. Have as many registered leaders on hand as possible to answer questions and to help register new youth and adults in the program. Here are some reminders that will help you have a successful recruitment night:

1. Contact the Pine Tree Council by August 20th with your Race To Scouting recruitment location and date of either September 19th or 21st. Please start your recruitment night at 6:30 PM to help with Council-wide publicity information. 2. Work with other Packs and Troops in the same community so everyone recruits new kids and adults.

3. Talk to your local school about an in-class promotion with the boys, a few days before the sign-up night, to build their enthusiasm.

4. Make sure that your local religious affiliation is aware of the nights because many will include this information in their worship service bulletins.

5. Talk with local businesses about placing information on their marquees promoting Race To Scouting.

6. Place posters in stores and high traffic areas. 7. Some grocery stores will place a flyer in shopping bags.

8. Cable access stations will sometimes promote sign-up

night.

9. Local phone companies will put info on their monthly bills.

10. Encourage your registered Cub Scouts to wear their uniform to school on the day of your Race To Scouting event

11. Invite a local Boy Scout Troop to help keep the kids entertained while you talk with the parents.

12. Have your treasurer attend your recruitment night Signup so that one check with the correct pro-rated fees can be written to the Pine Tree Council to avoid losing any money. 13. Make a great first impression by being organized.

14. Have a calendar of events for the new scout and their family so they are prepared for the upcoming activities.

15. All applications and appropriate pro-rated fees should be taken to the drop-off location on Thursday, September 21st unless other arrangements have been made with the District Executive.

16. Have fun and show new families the excitement of Scouting.

17. Before your new families leave the registration night. make sure they know the time, date, and location of your next scheduled den or pack meeting.

18. Families should have phone numbers of key unit leadership.

19. The Pine Tree Council will also be doing some direct mail promotions to families in your area with the registration night information.

Race To Scouting application drop-off locations will be given to you at your district Race To Scouting orientation. Please make sure that your applications have all the proper signatures and pro-rated fees before delivering them to the proper collection site on September 21st.

# Tribute to William U. Niss



The Pine Tree Council recently lost a great friend and longtime supporter. On March 30, 2006, William U. Niss, 90, of Scarborough, passed away.

Bill served in the Pine Tree Council for 60 years, starting as a volunteer leader in the Sea Scouting program.

He was President of the council's executive board from 1957 to 1959, and was instrumental in developing the council's headquarters on Auburn Street in Portland.

In 1959, he received the Silver Beaver Award. For several years, he was Assistant Treasurer of the council.

In 1981, the council honored Mr. Niss by naming its headquarters after him. In his later years, he did a lot of work for the council's endowment fund.

When the Pine Tree Council built new headquarters near the Maine Mall last year, Mr. Niss was honored with a museum that bears his name.

Sarah Hall Niss of Blue Hill reflected on her father's love for scouting and what it meant for him to have the museum named after him. "He was very humbled," she said. "He felt very honored."

Bill provided a lasting legacy of service to the Pine Tree Council. His vision and leadership paved a path that many have trod. He will surely be missed, but never forgotten.

# The New Internet Advancement

Online advancement entry is coming! The Pine Tree Council is excited to announce that units will be able to use Internet Advancement to record their vouth member advancements from any online location—at home or at the office. You will find this new method to be easy, convenient, and accurate because you enter the information.

### Here's how it works:

The Pine Tree Council will have an Internet Advancement page on our Web site (www.pinetreebsa.org) with instructions and a link to this new functionality.

Internet Advancement makes it easy for unit leadership to record awards, ranks, and merit badges to youth via an online process. This system is separate from Internet Rechartering, but uses a similar concept.

At any time during the year, the unit advancement processor from each active unit will be able to record advancements to youth member records. And, they'll also be able to print a unit roster at any time. The roster is the most current information from ScoutNET, and it will include the person ID for each adult and youth member.

### These are other reports that will be available from Internet Advancement.

• Unit Advancement Summary shows ranks, merit badges, and awards saved in each person record for current members of the unit.

• Advancement Report lists each youth member that has new ranks, merit badges, and awards, if any. This is the official unit Advancement Report to be signed and submitted to the office.

• Unit Awards Summary lists the number of new ranks. merit badges, and awards by name as a shopping list.

· Advancement Update Summary lists any ranks, merit badges, and awards that were already in the member record and were updated online.

The council will provide each unit with a unit ID, and the unit will assign an adult to record advancements. Ranks must be recorded based on program identification and in the correct rank and date sequence. Only the Eagle Scout rank cannot be awarded by this process. Awards to be entered will not include nominated awards, such as those for meritorious action, and awards that are controlled by other organizations, even if approved for uniform wear. As BSA policies for rank entry are enforced, what units enter will meet these requirements.

There will be a link to the Internet Advancement help on the Pine Tree Council Web site, and there will also be a Frequently Asked Questions link on the Internet Advancement site and these should be reviewed. Watch for this site coming soon to the council website.
