COUNCIL NEWS

RACE TO SCOUTING

September is Race To Scouting month. This year's recruitment drive will be run a little different than in the past. The goal of this new plan is to not only help packs recruit boys, but to also recruit leaders, organize dens, and get new leaders to training. The District and Council commitment is to not only hold training to help your unit have a successful Race To Scouting Recruitment Night sign-up, but to also have a representative from the District attend the sign-up and help with recruitment of leadership. The goal of this sign-up plan is recruit and train qualified leaders for your packs in order to provide the best possible program for your youth. Look for information on trainings coming soon.

Our Sponsor for this year's event is again NAPA Auto Parts. NAPA has agreed to provide every new Cub Scout that registers between May 2007 and September 2007 a coupon to redeem at a local store for a free Pinewood Derby car. It is important that all registration forms are turned into the Pine Tree Council office as soon as possible or they might miss out on this opportunity. The best way to do this is to hand them in to the District representative the night of the recruitment!

Look over the Race To Scouting training materials that you will receive at your district training to make sure that you have a great night set up for the parents and the kids. Have as many registered leaders on hand as possible to answer questions and to help register new adults and kids in the program. Here are some reminders that will help you have a successful recruitment night:

1. Contact the Pine Tree Council by August 17th with your Race To Scouting recruitment location and date in September. Please start your recruitment night at 6:30 PM in order to accommodate the full program..
2. Work with other Packs and Troops in the same community so everyone recruits new kids and adults.

3. Talk to your local school about an in class promotion with the boys, a few days before the sign-up night, to build their enthusiasm.
4. Make sure that your local religious affiliation is aware of the nights because many will include this information in their worship service bulletins.
5. Talk with local businesses about placing information on their marquees promoting Race To Scouting.
6. Place posters in stores and high traffic areas.
7. Some Grocery stores will place a flyer in shopping bags.
8. Cable access stations will sometimes promote sign-up night.
9. Local phone companies will put info on their monthly bills.
10. Encourage your registered Cub Scouts to wear their uniform to school on the day of your Race To Scouting event.
11. Invite a local Boy Scout Troop to help keep the kids entertained while you talk with the parents.
12. Have your treasurer attend your recruitment night Sign-up so that one check with the correct pro-rated fees can be written to the Pine Tree Council to avoid losing any money.
13. Make a great first impression by being organized.
14. Have a calendar of events for the new scout and their family so they are prepared for the upcoming activities.
15. Have fun and show new families the excitement of Scouting.
16. Before your new families leave the registration night, make sure they know the time, date, and location of your next scheduled den or pack meeting.
17. Families should have phone numbers of key unit leadership.
18. The Pine Tree Council will also be doing some direct mail promotions to families in your area with the registration night information.

New NATIONAL PARENT INITIATIVE PROGRAM

The mission is to develop and implement methods that increase the passion and participation of volunteers, especially parents of Scouts. Promoting parental understanding and appreciation of Scouting will be the foundation from which all methods will develop. It is our intent to highlight the importance of Scouting in the development of youth.

The vision of the program is:

"A passionate parent initiative that continually increases youth and parent recruitment, retention, advancement, participation, determination, and a passion for Scouting."

By adopting this vision at all program levels, units will be able to access new avenues of support that will serve to increase program quality. The vision captures our

passionate attitude about Scouting, and it can inspire many parents to become involved and more committed to the success of their child's Scouting experience.

All units are encouraged to adopt the program as an integral part of their unit's program. It is a part of one of the requirements to earn the new Centennial Quality Award beginning in this year.

The objectives established for the program initiative include:

- Increase parent recruitment.
- Increase parent retention.
- Increase parent participation.
- Increase youth advancement.
- Increase youth determination.
- Increase the passion for participation in Scouting by youth and parents.

As part of the basic program, each youth member's family will be encouraged to:


- 1) Complete a "Parent Talent Survey" and turn in to their unit;
- 2) Influence their child to become a Scout;
- 3) Participate in Scouting directly with their child;
- 4) Go to and observe Scout meetings;
- 5) Be part of the unit's program-- both weekly meetings and outings;

- 6) Support the program financially;
- 7) Coach their child's advancement and the earning of recognition awards; and
- 8) Serve in one support role during the Scouting year.

Each unit should select someone to serve on their unit committee to accept the responsibility for delivery and coordination. This person would be responsible for keeping the parents informed of the unit's programs and needs. They would provide new parents with:

- 1) A welcome package of how the unit works.
- 2) Provide an orientation for all parents to answer questions and share the benefits of the Scouting program to their family.
- 3) Keep all parents updated on the unit's program and their child's involvement.
- 4) Secure a parent's commitment to help with an assignment or project annually.



* Thanks to all Brothers who served on staff and attended the University of Scouting at the Central Maine Community College in Auburn in March. Approximately 40 members served with setup, lunch duty, course instructions and at the lodge trading post during the annual event. Your service was an inspiration to all!

* Lodge leadership will attend the second National Conservation and Leadership Summit which will take place July 28 through August 1, 2007 at Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana. This summit has a twofold purpose. The first will be to train key site leadership and squad leaders for the 2008 ArrowCorps5. The second purpose of the NCLS is to introduce to key leaders of lodges and sections the 2008-2012 Order of the Arrow Strategic Plan. It will be the first summit-type event held since the National Leadership Summit of 1999, where Madockawanda Lodge was also well represented.
