SLEEPOVER AT THE SEA DOGS ~ SAVE THE DATE!! JUNE 9th





National Summertime Pack Award



A pack can qualify for the National Summertime Pack Award by planning and conducting three pack activities - one each in June, July, and August. This award can be an incentive for greater attendance at your summer pack activities.

Individual scouts that participate in all three pack events can receive the National Summertime Pack Award pin. Starting in 2008, there is a different color pin for each Cub Scout rank so earning the pin each year has more incentive.



Tiger Cubs, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts, and Webelos Scouts have the opportunity to earn the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award. Boys may earn the award in each of the program years as long as the requirements are completed each year. The first time the award is earned, the boy will receive the pocket flap award (shown above), which is to be worn on the right pocket flap of the uniform shirt. Each successive time the award is earned, a wolf track pin (also shown above) may be added to the flap. Leaders should encourage boys to build on skills and experiences from previous years when working on the award for a successive year. A GREAT PACK ACTIVITY!

Most Cub Scout Packs choose a particular weekend or weekends to attend and register together as a pack. Use this activity to qualify for the Summertime Pack Award or the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award!

Sorry, but due to space restrictions, siblings are not allowed at FunPacks!

Camp will provide the campsites with tents and cots along with a great program! The pack is responsible for food and cooking at all FunPack Weekends. Most packs find that this can be a very fun activity in itself. During the day, you will experience exciting activities! Enjoy your time at the Craftshop, BB & archery ranges, swimming, sports, nature hikes and games! As evening comes wind down with a quiet campfire and enjoy the fellowship of your pack in your site. Marshmallows and s'mores are a must!

A FPW Leaders Guide will be mailed to the FPW leader once registered and is available online! The guide gives information on arrival times, what to bring, health forms, daily schedule and directions to camp!

How to sign up: Most Packs choose a weekend to attend and register together as a pack. Choose a date and let all of your families know as early as possible with a deadline for when to get their money into the Pack to reserve their spot as space allows. *Once the majority of families have decided to attend, send in your Pack reservation with the money due to Pine Tree Council. You can then add additional families to your counts once reserved for a specific weekend.* Single families or small groups will be placed with other small groups.



Whether you're an Ordeal, Brotherhood, or Vigil member of the Order of the Arrow we invite you to spend Week 1 at Camp Hinds participating in a specialized Order of the Arrow program. Mountain Man

The mountain man program is a fun and educational reenactment adventure that will take Scouts back to the mid-19th century into the world of the western exploration and the central fur trading era. This year we have expanded our mountain man program to run the full week; Scouts will partake in several challenges and activities throughout camp including mountain moan overnights. EMPLOYMENT & TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES!

COUNSELOR IN TRAINING PROGRAM SESSION 1: WEEKS 2-4, SESSION 2: WEEKS 5-7 (WEBELOS)

Pine Tree Council offers a CIT program at Camp Hinds for interested Scouts of at least 15 years of age. The CIT program has been designed to introduce them to life as a Staff Member and so that the Scouts in the program will have increasing responsibilities at camp, all the time learning leadership, teaching and communication skills. Typically during Week 1, Scouts will be able to earn merit badges and learn teamwork by participating in troop rotations as a CIT troop. Week 2 finds our CITs taking limited merit badges while doing observations and some limited assisting in many different areas throughout camp. Week 3 they will experience life as a camp staff, assisting in merit badge instruction, helping with rotations and evening activities at camp, including our campfires.

Scouts who complete this program may be eligible for staff positions the following year. The Program Cost for the 3 weeks is \$200. To apply, fill out a staff application located at <u>www.camphinds.org</u> or by calling the PTC office.

PTC REFUND POLICY

Individuals or groups that cancel a program reservation 30 days prior to the date of the event will receive a refund of fees paid less a 15% administrative charge.

No refunds will be made after the 30-day cancellation period.

CAMPERSHIPS

A limited amount of campership funds are available to help those Scouts who could not attend summer camp without financial assistance. To apply for a 2012 campership, families should complete the 2012 PTC Campership Application and return to PTC by April 1st. All families will be notified after that date of a possible campership acceptance. Generally only partial camperships are given out except in extreme conditions. Campership forms can be found online at <u>www.pinetreebsa.org</u> or <u>www.camphinds.org</u>. The deadline for applying for a 2012 campership is April 1st.


